Political leaders are often in the limelight but sometimes the real heroines, the people that make today's New Order society work, get overlooked.


This is a celebration of some of those that are not always seen in the headlines.

Detection rates and convictions for male misdemeanours have increased dramatically under her control.

Recognised as one of the country's most innovative and creative engineers, Gabrielle's designs are now widely used in Government-approved chastity management programmes.


Research at Horning has allowed devices to be created to suit almost every variation in member size and shape, making possible their use right across the male population.

Sue Gerat's business "Home Restraints" has become the go-to provider of cages, shackles, pillories and other equipment for the home dungeon.



Her "Under The Thumb" workshops have helped women to learn how to take the lead role in relationships.


Education for women has been an important goal for New Order and Anna's course have allowed tens of thousands of women to acquire the fundamental skills needed to deal with men in a female led society.

With over 10 million regular readers, Dommes-net is the most widely used source of information for women in the UK.


Lara, Jenny and Sophie's videos demonstrating dominance techniques are universally popular.

Her philosophy of women-only dining and male-only servers chimes exactly with the expectations of those women that have benefited from new levels of wealth and leisure under New Order.


Her reputation as a ferocious chef-patron is well earned.

A committed communicator, Lucia's interviews and documentaries have covered issues as complex and controversial as male chastity management, home discipline regimes and the control of male financial assets.


Lucia is also adviser to the government on policy communication matters.

New Order's introduction of designated leash-zones for males was just part of their response to the popular support her proposals won.


Leash-zones have now been added to by male-exclusion zones and woman-only public transport services as a direct result of Danielle's work.

Her work has allowed the Government to seize billions of pounds in illegally held male assets which have been diverted to the woman most appropriate to hold them, or to the national exchequer if none can be found.

Funds raised by Angela are fuelling the New Order revolution.



Gillian Dacre's chain of health clubs spas and beauty treatment centres were among the first to take advantage of the new employment arrangements for men and were soon popular places for women to relax and recharge.

Helping men to redeploy from decision-making positions into roles in the service industry has allowed unemployment rates to be kept low while ensuring MDDM in the workplace is minimised.
